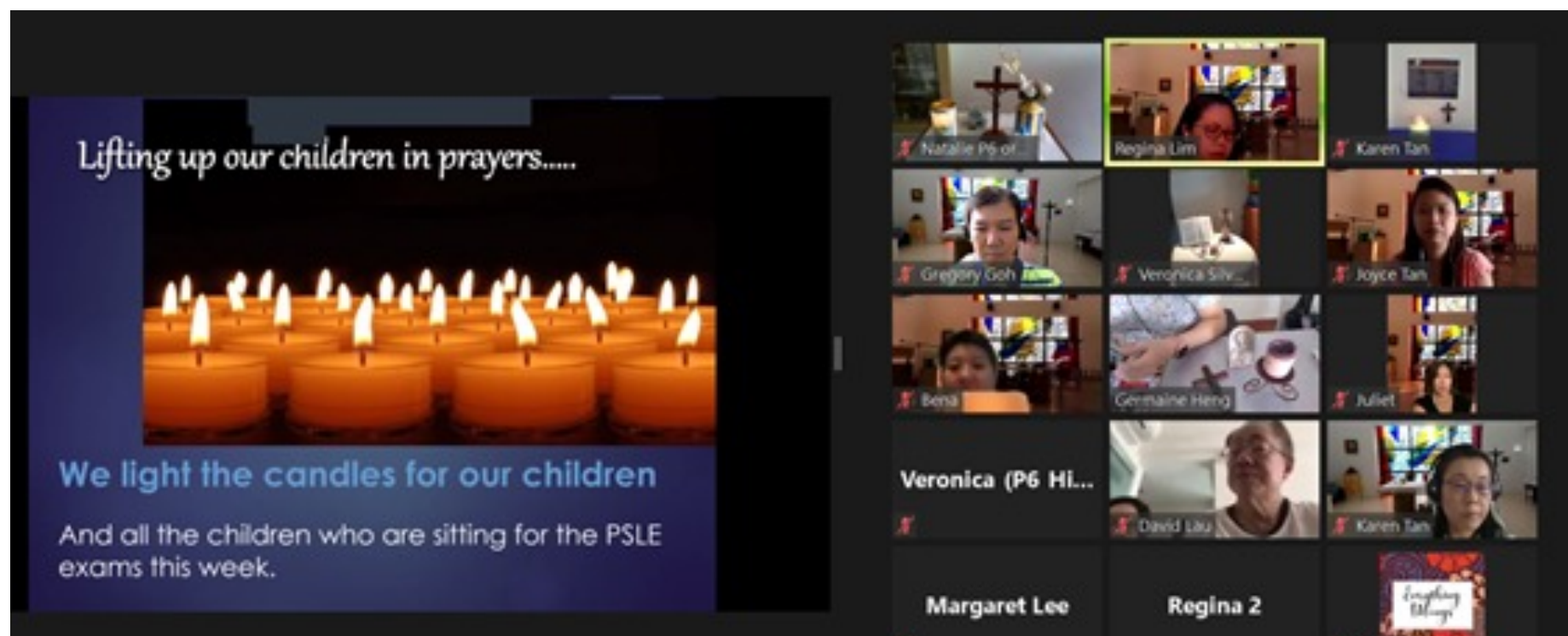
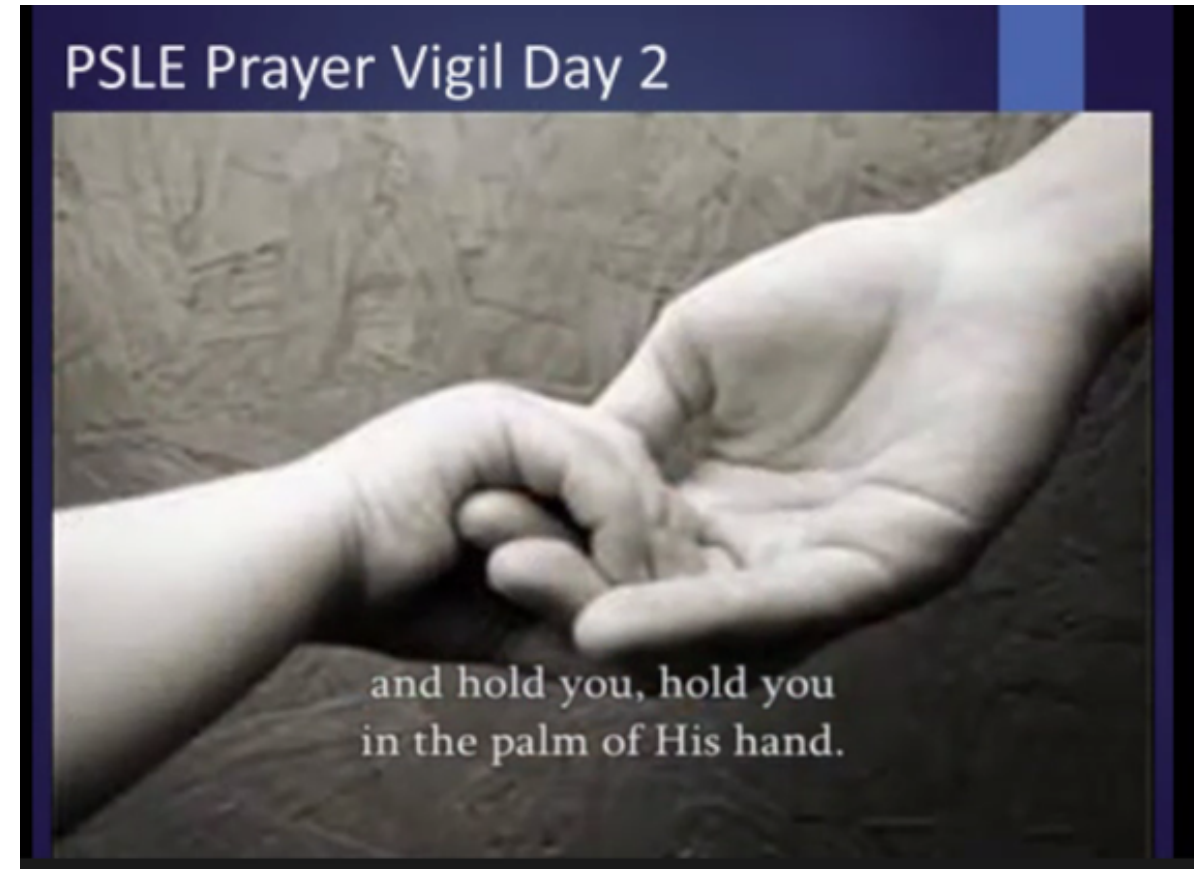


PSLE Prayer Vigil I – 7 Oct 2020
